All families are invited to participate in the survey.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones.

The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese. Resources are also available in additional languages to assist parents / caregivers / guardians who speak a language other than English at home. Please reach out to your child's teacher, or the school directly for survey guides in your language.

The survey results will be communicated to parents / caregivers / guardians through annual reporting or via Wiran.

During the vacation program, all meals are supplied and included in the fee.

The vacation program operates from 8am-6pm Monday to Friday except public holidays.

Child Care Subsidy (CCS)

Families are able to apply to Centrelink for Child Care Subsidy (CCS) to reduce their child care costs.

CCS is paid directly to the service and will be deducted from your account. Families need to apply to Centrelink for CCS and must ensure that the subsidy is current before each vacation program or commencing care.

You will be charged for all booked days regardless of whether you attend or not. CCS pays a subsidy for 42 absence days each financial year. After the 42 absence days have been reached, you will be charged the full fee for all absences unless a doctor's certificate is provided.




Platypus Collage
